

CITY OF ROCKWALL BOARDS and COMMISSIONS

The following information is a summary of the City of Rockwall's boards and commissions. In addition to those described below, Rockwall's City Council may occasionally appoint short-term committees for special purposes. **All appointees to City boards and commissions must be residents of the City of Rockwall and must also be registered (city) voters.** All appointments are made by the Rockwall City Council (or, in the case of the Housing Authority, by the Mayor). Architectural Review Board (ARB)

The ARB consists of seven members who serve two-year, staggered terms (max. of three, full terms (6 years)). The board meets twice monthly - on the 2nd and last Tuesday - at 5:00 p.m. at City Hall (just prior to scheduled P&Z Commission meetings). The ARB serves as an advisory board to the Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) and Planning Director. Members provide professional recommendations regarding site plans and building elevations submitted within city zoning districts.

Art Review Team (ART) Commission

The Art Review Team ("ART Commission") consists of seven members and serve two-year terms (max of three terms, or 6 years). It meets the 1st Tuesday of each month at 1:00 p.m. at City Hall. This Commission is advisory in nature and exists to:

- (a) promote the Art in Public Places Master Plan;
- (b) develop, evaluate and recommend projects;
- (c) actively explore potential sites for Art in Public Places projects.

Board of Adjustments (BOA)

The Board of Adjustments (BOA) meets on an "as needed" basis. It is regulatory in nature and was created in accordance with the provisions of [V.T.C.A., Local Government Code § 211.008](#). The BOA consists of five (5) members who serve two-year, staggered terms (max. of three, full terms (6 years)). The City Council appoints four (4) "Alternate Members" to the BOA as well.

Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee (CPAC)

This seven member Committee periodically meets to perform extensive review and make recommendations on revisions to the City's "Our Hometown 2040" Comprehensive Plan. The CPAC works in conjunction with the City's Planning Director, staff and City Council, serving as an integral part in the process of periodically updating the City's Comp Plan.

Historic Preservation Advisory Board (HPAB)

This Board helps the City protect, enhance, and perpetuate the historically significant areas and landmarks within the City. It consists of seven members who serve two-year, staggered terms (max. of three, full terms (6 years)). Its duties include providing professional recommendations to the City Council and Planning and Zoning Commission regarding site plans, building alternatives, and building plans proposed within the City Historic Overlay (HOV) District. Main Street Advisory Board (MSAB)

Comprised of seven board members, the MSAB is an advisory board to the City Council. It meets monthly on the 3rd Tuesday at 5:00 p.m. at City Hall. Members serve two-year terms (max. of three terms, or 6 years). MSAB members are representative of the community, including downtown business and property owners and citizens with a general interest in downtown revitalization. The Board exists to create an inviting, historic downtown district that serves as a center for recreational, economic and cultural activity.

Planning & Zoning Commission (P&Z)

The P&Z Commission acts as an advisory board to City Council. It is comprised of seven members who serve three-year terms on a staggered basis (max. of two full terms (or 6 years)). The Commission meets the 2nd and last Tues. monthly at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall. The P&Z Commission advises City Council and makes recommendations concerning adoption of, or amendments to, zoning regulations and the zoning map; the City's Comprehensive Plan, Master Thoroughfare Plan, and Parks and Recreation Master Plan. Rockwall Economic Development Corporation (REDC)

Comprised of seven board members, this board was established to promote and develop commercial, industrial, and manufacturing enterprises in Rockwall as a result of the ½ cent sales tax, which was passed by voters in November 1995. Board Members serve a maximum of three, two-year terms (total of 6 years). The board meets the second Thursday of the month at 8:00 a.m. at 2610 Observation Trail, Suite 104, Rockwall, TX 75032. Rockwall Housing Authority (RHA)

The RHA Board of Directors is comprised of five members, **each appointed by the Mayor**. The Executive Director is an Ex-Officio member of the board with no voting rights. The RHA is organized exclusively for the purpose of benefiting and accomplishing public purposes in accordance with the Housing Authorities Law, as provided by [Chapter 392 of the Texas Local Government Code](#). Board Members serve two-year, staggered terms (max. of three, full terms (6 years)).

Airport Advisory Board

Animal Adoption Center / Shelter Advisory Committee

Consisting of five members, the purpose of the Animal Adoption Center / Shelter Advisory Committee is to assist the City with compliance regarding state law pertaining to animal shelters, [Texas State Health & Safety Code, Ch. 823.005](#). This committee is comprised of: one licensed local veterinarian, one municipal official, one representative from an animal welfare organization, and one person whose duties include the daily operation of the city's animal adoption center/shelter. They meet on an ‘as needed’ basis.
