

Rockwall Disc Golf Course Ranked Among Top in the WORLD!

Once again, Rockwall has been recognized for excellence on the world stage! The disc golf course at Harry Myers Park has been named one of the top courses... in the world. The ranking comes from Udisc.com, which is the leading app utilized by disc golfers. The Rockwall disc golf course ranked 94th—out of 13,000 courses reviewed. This honor comes as no surprise to the Rockwall Parks and Recreation Department, which regularly maintains the course to ensure its superiority.

To retain elite status, Rockwall PARD had the course redesigned in the fall of 2018, and hosted the Nick Hyde Memorial A-Tier Tournament the next spring, drawing the top pro players from across the US. The redesign has been applauded by experts for both its beauty and complexity. Of note, the judges mentioned that a majority of the top ranked courses charge players fees to maintain their excellence, but Harry Myers Disc Golf Course is among the few that remain free for all players.

Love Your Landscape: Spring into Action

Are you ready to get your lawn in shape for spring? Here are some tips for better lawn maintenance:

- Perform a spring check-up on your irrigation system which can save thousands of gallons of water and lots of money
- Put out pre-emergents if you haven't already, and make sure you follow the label
- Mulch your landscape beds, but no more than 2" thick
- Do preventive maintenance on your mower, and most importantly install new blade
- Scalp your lawn back to at least 1" tall to remove all the dead grass, and make room for new grass to grow
- Don't prune live oaks or red oaks between now and June, unless it is a safety hazard, to prevent possible oak wilt infection
- Put out your first application of fertilizer when your lawn is about 50% green, apply it at a rate of 1.25 lbs of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet
