

CITY DECOMMISSIONING SQUABBLE CREEK WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY

The City began the decommissioning process for the Squabble Creek Wastewater Treatment Facility, located at 2219 Dickson Lane, in August. The facility, in continuous operation since 1975, has served the community for five decades and is now being retired as part of the City's and North Texas Municipal Water District's (NTMWD) longterm infrastructure and wastewater management plan. The NTMWD handles the decommissioning process, which will include emptying tanks, removing accumulated sludge, and dismantling certain portions of the plant's infrastructure.



CITY PROPOSES 2026 BUDGET WITH 1-CENT TAX RATE INCREASE

Rockwall City Manager, Mary Smith, is proposing an increased tax rate of 25.75 cents per \$100 of assessed value for the upcoming fiscal year, October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026, an increase of just over one cent from the prior year. This would bring the average residential tax bill to \$1,217, an increase of \$151 compared to last year, based on the average taxable home value of \$472,950. Homeowners over the age of 65 will continue to benefit from the City's senior tax freeze program, which prevents increases in their property tax bills. The proposed increase is intended to fund critical priorities such as street reconstruction projects, competitive pay for public safety personnel, and ongoing park and infrastructure improvements. Approximately 60% of the tax rate would fund daily operations, while 40% would be allocated to debt service. The City Council will review the budget in the month of September. PUBLIC RECORDS REQUESTS TRANSITION TO JUSTFOIA

In the month of September, the City of Rockwall will transition to a new software to receive and manage requests for public information. JustFOIA, a secure and efficient online platform for processing requests, will replace the City's current system, GovQA. Pending requests in GovQA will continue to be processed as usual through this transitional period. The new platform will result in some enhanced capabilities. Key Features of JustFOIA include:

- 1. Online Request Submissions: The public may request records through the JustFOIA portal without the need to register or create an account within the system
- 2. Real-Time Tracking: Users may receive email notifications as their request moves through different phases of
- 3. Secure Communication: Requestors may communicate directly with staff within the system for clarification and updates
- 4. Various Payment Methods: The system will accept payments via credit and debit cards, as well as e-checks, in addition to in-person payments.

"The ability to invoice and collect payments electronically will be a notable enhancement, proving much more convenient options for customers to pay for requested records. We appreciate the public's patience and understanding as staff aims to make this transition as seamless as possible. INTERSTATE 30 UPDATES

TxDOT's ongoing construction projects in Rockwall continue to bring major roadway improvements, including the widening of the I-30 bridges over John King Blvd. and FM 3549/Stodghill Rd. As part of this work, on-ramp closures and lane shifts are expected through the end of the year. Progress continues on the Horizon Bridge expansion, with traffic now on the new, eastside, lanes and construction of the west side coming soon.

Speed limits have been reduced to 35 MPH on all frontage roads within City limits. Residents and drivers should use extra

caution when navigating these lanes and temporary business driveways in the area.

Progress continues on the I-30 eastbound frontage road over the lake, with drilling underway on the westbound side.

Fall is coming, so it's time to prep your landscape for winter. As cooler temperatures approach, it's the perfect time to start preparing your lawn and landscape for the winter months. A little effort now will ensure a healthier, greener yard come spring.

Apply fall pre-emergent herbicides around October 15th to help prevent

winter weeds like Henbit and Poa Annua from taking root.

Avoid overseeding with Ryegrass unless necessary to prevent winter erosion. Ryegrass can damage warm-season turf and cause spring transition issues. If you must overseed, choose a perennial tri-blend of Ryegrass, Kentucky Bluegrass, and turf-type Fescue for better results.

Prune trees between November and March. This is the ideal window to

promote strong growth and reduce stress on your trees.

Don't forget that final fertilizer application! Use a 3-1-2 ratio fertilizer like 15-5-10, applying at 1 lb. of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet to strengthen the fall and landscape beds through the winter.

A little prep this fall means less worry and more growth in the spring!
