PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION MEETING HELD December 6, 1972

The Rockwall Planning and Zoning Commission met in its regularly scheduled meeting on December 6, 1972, at 6:30 P.m. in the City Hall. The following members were present: Kenneth Glasscock, and Kenneth Smith. Jess Whittle, Chairman, presided.

A request by Billy Peoples for rezoning of a lot adjacent to Browning property on Terrell Road was presented.

Mr. Bill Lofland expressed opposition to rezoning a small area as requested. It was determined that the tract on which rezoning was requested was not adjacent to L.I. District and would be spot zoning.

Larry Delzell presented Folsom Properties' request for change of zoning on 30.57 acres, located in the A. Hanna Survey, from A and SF-2 to MF-1. The Commission was advised that proper motice had been served to interested parties. There was no opposition to the requested change. Mr. Glasscock moved that the requested zoning change be recommended to the City Council. Mr. Smith seconded this motion and the Commission voted unanimous approval.

Plans for Phase IV of Lakeside Village were presented by Harold Evans. John Nall's comments regarding the plat were read. The recommendations by Mr. Nall had been complied with. Mr. Glasscock moved that the plans be approved. Mr. Smith seconded this motion and the Commission voted unanmously in favor.

Preliminary Plat of Phase II of Saddle Brook Valley Addition was presented. Mr. John Nall's comments concerning this plat were reviewed. The plat presented conformed to Mr. Nall's recommendations. Mr. Smith moved to approve the plat. Mr. Glasscock seconded this motion and an unanimous vote in favor was cast.

The rezoning of tracts owned by Billy Ridley and Cecil Kindle, A. L. Cross, Jim Hunt, James Reese, Cecil Unruh and Billy Peoples, requested at the prior month's meeting of the Plan Commission, was reviewed. The Commission was advised that failure to file an approved final plat by Mr. J. C. Taylor, the original owner of part of the property, had no bearing on a zoning change being granted. It was explained to those present that no building permits would be granted until a final plat on the Taylor property had been approved by the Plan Commission and City Council.

After quite lenghty discussion Mr. Smith made a Motion that the City Council investigate failure by James Dudney and V. T. Cooper to file sub-division plats on property in Rockwall, sold in separate tracts.

No further business came before the Commission, and the meeting was adjourned.

Galen Williams City Secretary Alderman Tate made a motion that Todd Crawford's salary be increased 5.5% effective immediately. Alderman Gheen seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimous approval.

Discussion of the purchase of a new tractor with front end loader and backhoe for use by the City street department was heard. The Council authorized the City Secretary to extend invitations for bids on such equipment to area tractor dealers.

By unanimous vote the Council authorized installation of a "No Parking" sign for one space at Mitchell's Hardware Store's rear door on South San jacinto Street.

No further business came before the Council, and the meeting was adjourned.

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL HELD January 8, 1973

The Rockwall City Council met in its regular meeting on January 8, 1973, at 7:30 P. M., in the City Hall. The follow-members were present: Arthur Kuhlman, Randolph Gheen, Roger McCallum, Garvin Tate, and Harry knight. Mayor Myers presided.

The minumetes of the December 4, 1972, meeting were approved as read.

The City Secretary was instructed to write members of the City Plan Commission regarding zoning re-classification of areas zoned MF-1.

Also pesent were Jim Spillman, Harold Evans, Jerry Lockhart, Jim Vaughn, Gerald Burgamy, Cecil Kindle, Haywood Eason, Bill Bell, Billy Peoples, J. T. Price, Cecil Unruh and Jack Ritchey.

The Plan Commission's recommendations that tracts of land owned by Cecil Kindle and Billy Ridley, A. L. Cross, Jim Hunt, James Reese, Cecil Unruh, Billy Peoples and Don Holland be rezoned from A to C as requested. Alderman McCallum made a motion that the zoning change be granted. Alderman Tate seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimous approval. The City Secretary was instructed to prepare the necessary ordinances to make the zoning changes official.

The Plan Commission's recommendation that zoning of a 30.57 acre tract owned by R. S. Folsom Investments be changed from A and SF-3 to MF-1 was presented. After discussion Alderman Tate

moved that action on this matter be delayed until there is a better understanding by the Council of plans for development of the other Folsom property in the area. Alderman Knight seconded this motion and the council voted unanimous approval.

The final plat of Phase 4 of Lakeside Village was presented along with the City's engineer's letter of comments regarding this plat. The Council was advised by Mr. Harold Evans that all recommendations by the engineer had been complied with.

Alderman Tate moved that the plat be approved upon receipt of a letter from the City's engineer stating that recommendations have been complied with. Alderman Kuhlman seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimously in favor. The Mayor was authorized to sign the plat on behalf of the City.

Jerry Lockhart was present to discuss the sub-division ordinance provision regarding underground utilities. Mr. Lockhart pointed out that problems supplying electric power to developments beyond those which have underground wires could be encountered unless a special provision is included in the ordinances to allow deviation by the utility company.

Alderman Gheen moved that the sub-division ordinance contain a provision that in unusual or unique situations the City Council shall be empowered to make variances or exceptions to this requirement for underground electrical utilities. Alderman McCallum seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimous approval.

Bruce Beaty, Chief of Police, advised the Council that the 1972 patrol car is using a quart of oil each 218 miles driven and is progressively getting worse, and presented 2 bids for the sale of a new patrol car to the City. The Council agreed to have the motor of the '72 car overhauled rather than purchase a new car.

Consideration was given to the employment of radio dispatchers, and the purchase of radios. The Council agreed that the above is needed but could not be financed at this time and recommended that an ad be placed in the Rockwall Success in an effort to obtain dispatchers on a voluntary basis.

Discussion of how the revenue sharing money would be spent was heard. It was decided by the Council that a portion of these funds be spent for radio equipment for the police department, W/S department and Street Department.

Alderman Gheen made a motion that \$7,000.00 of Revenue Sharing Funds received for the year 1972 be spent to purchase a tractor with front end loader, and that \$4,876.00 be spent for police department radio equipment. Alderman Knight seconded this motion, and the Council voted unanimously in favor.

Gheen seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimous approval.

The Council voted unanimously in favor of a motion by Alderman Tate, seconded by Alderman McCallum to have T.P.&L. install a street light at 605 Bost Street.

Alderman Tate made a motion that the City's street department purchase and put rock on the 900 block of North West Street. Alderman Kuhlman seconded the motion and the Council voted unanimous approval.

A retirement program for City employees was discussed. The Council felt that to participate in such plan the employees would be required to forfiet the cost of living increase in salary which would probably be granted in May. The City Secretary was instructed to survey the employees to determine if they are interested in retirement on this basis. If such survey proves that the employees are interested, detailed retirement plans are to be secured.

Ben Klutts, Raymond Cameron and A. M. Rodgers were appointed by the Mayor and Council to serve as a committee to obtain candidates for Mayor and 2 aldermen in the upcoming City Officials' Election.

The assignment of Lakeside Marina Lease Agreement by the City of Dallas to the City of Rockwall was presented to the Council. After reviewing the assignment, Alderman Tate made motion the assignment be accepted, provided it meets approval of the City's attorney. Alderman Knight seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimously in favor. The City Secretary was instructed to forward the assignment to Bob Baker, the City's attorney, for approval.

The Council voted to employ Southwestern Appraisal Company to appraise new construction in Rockwall for the purpose of assessing taxes for 1973, and authorized the Mayor and City Secretary to sign a contract with Southwestern Appraisal Company.

No further business came before the Council, and the meeting was adjourned.

The Rockwall City Council met in its regular session on March 5, 1973, at 7:30 P.M. in the City Hall. The following members were present: Roger McCallum, Arthur Kuhlman, Garvin Tate and Harry Knight. Mayor Harry F. Myers presided.

Also present were: Edwin Jennings, Mr. & Mrs. Don Holland, Clifford Dawson, F. P. Hughes, Ray Ratcliff, Larry Delzell, Bob Clark, Dave Brown, Sammy Buffington, Walter Price, M. D. Jurdkin and Bruce Peaty.

The minutes of February 5, 1973, Bebruary 9, 1973 and February 14, 1973, meetings were approved as read.

Clifford Dawson's request for a quit claim deed to an un-named street in the Farmers and Merchants Addition to the City of Rockwall was presented. It was explained that subject street has never been used and is not shown on the City maps. Alderman Tate moved that the City grant Mr.Dawson a quit claim deed to this street. Alderman McCallum seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimously in favor.

The Plan Commission's recommendation that six tracts of land, owned by Folsom Company, be rezoned as requested was presented. Representatives of Folsom Co.were advised what would be expected by the Council as maximum density. Alderman Kuhlman moved that the requested and recommended zoning changes be granted. Alderman Tate seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimously in favor.

Alderman Tate made a motion that the tract of land owned by J. P Johnson, Kenneth English and Ward Hudspth, located between FM 740 and M.K.T. Railroad be rezoned as requested by the owners, and recommended by the Plan Commission. Alderman Kuhlman seconded this metion and the Council voted unanimous approval.

The matter of granting homestead tax exemptions to qualifying citizens was discussed. Alderman Tate made a motion that the City grant such exemption. Alderman McCallum seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimously in favor. Resolution #73-A was adopted.

Ordinance #73-15 was adopted by unanimous approval of the Council after a motion by Alderman Kuhlman was seconded by Alderman McCallum.

Alderman Tate moved adoption of Ordinance #73-16. Alderman Kuhlman seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimously in favor.

Alderman Tate made a motion that the firm of Williams, McCroy and Williams be employed to do the City's annual audit. Alderman Kuhlman seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimous approval.

The Council voted unanimously not to purchase a maintenance contract on the NCR aschunting machine.

The Council voted to assess a charge of \$2.00 for handling insufficient funds checks, after a motion by Alderman Kuhlman was seconded by Alderman Tate.

A bid of \$3.00 per foot for installation of curb and gutter at the First Christian Church was presented. The Council agreed to accept this bid and instructed the City Secretary to arrange to have the bidder, Mr. James Porter, of Terrell, do the curb and gutter installation at above location.

No further business came before the Council, and the meeting was adjourned.

The Rockwall City Council met in a called meeting on March 22, 1973, in the City Hall, at 7:30 PM. The following members were present: Randolph Gheen, Harry Knight, Garvin Tate and Arthur Kuhlman. Mayor Harry F. Myers presided.

Also present were Frank Buchanan, Mayor of Heath, Doug Hall, Huey Smirl, Bennie Abernathy, B.W. Tarrant and Martin Edwards, City of Heath Aldermen and John Sellon of Heath.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss disannexation of an approximately 30 acre tract of land, owned by Clarke-Frates, by Heath.

Mayor Myers reviewed prior discussion revelant to the construction of a water line to serve the Clarke-Frates property and disannexation of Clarke-Frates property by Heath.

The City of Heath's Gouncil members stated that their understanding was that the 30 acre tract was not in the initial deannexation proposal, and further stated that they are determined that this property will remain in Heath's city limits.

The Rockwall City Council agreed that Rockwall should assure Heath City Council that the de-annexation of the subject 30 acre tract is not required in order to proceed with the water line construction. The Rockwall City Council agreed to furnish Clarke-Frates the same number of water connections at the same rate on remaining acreage excluding the above mentioned 30 acres, as previously agreed.

The City of Heath agreed to furnish Clarke-Frates water for the subject 30 acres and to offer no objections to the location of sewerage treatment plant on this tract, provided such plant would

be abandoned upon availibility of regional sewerage facilities.

Ordinance No.73-17 was introduced by Alderman Gheen. After brief discussion, Alderman Tate moved adoption of this ordinance. Alderman Gheen seconded this motion, and the Council voted unanimous approval.

No further business came before the Council, and the meeting was adjourned.

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL HELD April 2, 1973

The Rockwall City Council met in its regularly scheduled meeting in the City Hall on April 2, 1973, at 7:30 P.M. The following members were present: Randolph Gheen, Garvin Tate, Roger McCallum, Arthur Kuhlman and Harry Knight. Mayor Harry F. Myers presided.

Also present were Wayne Rogers, Kenneth Glasscock, Kenneth Smith R. W. Pickens and Bob May, mambers of the Rockwall Plan Commission, Tom Allen, Newell Boughton and Harold Evans for Clarke-Frates Corporation, Jim Vaughn, Jim Spillman, Logan Wilson and Bill Portwood of Lone Star Gas Co., Bill Jackson and Bob Nichols of Freese and Nichols, Walter Stiles, Bob Collett and Jim Moore of Arcatel, Inc., Larry Delzell, Will Nabers and Ray Ratcliff of R. S. Folsom Company, Billy Peoples and Bruce Beaty.

Minutes of the March 5, 1973, and March 22, 1973, meetings were approved as read.

Mayor Myers explained that the Plan Commission members were present to observe presentation of the proposed Chandlers Landing development, so that the property could be annexed to the City of Rockwall and a planned development zoning classification granted simultaneously. Mr. Allen and Mr. Boughton presented films and plats showing planned development of the property. After quite lengthy discussion, these people were instructed to have their engineer meet with the City's engineer and the Rockwall Independent School District planners to work outdetails then present to the Rockwall Plan Commission and City Council for acceptance.

Mr. Stiles, Mr. Collett and Mr. Moore were present to request addoption by the City Council of an ordinance granting Arcatel, Inc. a cable television franchise in Rockwall. Mr. Stiles outlined advantages of cable T.V. A letter from Mr. Bob Baker, City Attorney, commenting on this matterwas read. After discussion, Alderman Tate made a motion that the City Council members review the ordinance further, individually, while Mr. Stiles meets with

Mr. Bob Baker to resolve the differences in the wording of the ordinance and Mr. Baker's suggested working. After such differences have been corrected to the satisfaction of Mr. Baker, a meeting of the City Council, Mr. Stiles and Mr. Baker will be arranged.

The City Secretary was instructed to arrange a meeting with Mr. Baker for Mr. Stiles on Wednesday, April 4, at 9:00 A.M.

Billy Peoples request for a specific use permit to allow distribution of food stamps by the State Welfare Department at 302 Williams Street was presented. The Council was advised that the Plan Commission had recommended that such permit be granted and that proper notification and publication had been made.

Alderman Gheen made a motion that a specifice use permit be granted. Alderman Knight seconded this motion and the Council voted_unanimously in favor. The City Secretary was instructed to prepare the necessary ordinance.

The Cambridge Company's request for rezoning of a triangle located adjacent to State Highway 205 and owned by them was presented. The City Secretary advised the Council that the Plan Commission had recommended the zoning change be granted. There was no opposition to the requested change.

Alderman Tate moved the zoning be changed as requested. Alderman Knight seconded the motion, and the Council voted unanimous approval.

The City Secretary was instructed to prepare the necessary ordinance.

North Shore Phase I plat, revised so as to provide ingress and egress via Heath Street, was presented. Alderman Gheen moved that the revised plat be approved and that the Mayor be authorized to sign said plat on behalf of the City. Alderman McCallum seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimous approval.

The matter of paving alleys separating Phase I of North Shore Subdivision from Highwood and Highland Hills Additions was discussed. The Council agreed that Folsom Company would be expected to pave these alleys and solicit participation by wowners of property abutting such alleys.

Mr. Logan Wilson presented, on behalf of Lone Star Gas Company, an ordinance establishing natural gas rates and explained that the requested rate increase would represent an average increase of \$1.51 per year per domestic customer and would provide for periodic increases subject to approval by the City Council. Alderman Knight moved that the ordinance be adopted. Alderman Gheen seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimous approval.

O. L. Steger, Bill Standley, Wayne Rogers and Kenneth Smith, members of the Rockwall Voluntary Fire Department, requested that a portion of the Revenue Sharing Funds, received by the City, be allocated for purchase of additional fire fighting equipment. After discussion, Alderman Knight made a motion that \$15,000.00 of the revenue sharing receipts be designated for fire fighting equipment. Alderman Gheen seconded this motion and the Council voted unanimous approval.

Discussion of repairing streets that have deteriorated in Highwood Addition was heard. Due to lack of a cost estimate the Council voted to instruct the street department to clean up loose asphalt andpatch streets as necessary until lan estimate of cost to replace rock and asphalt could be presented.

Proposed extensions of 6 water and sewer lines was presented. Due to lack of information, Alderman Tate made a motion that action on this matter be tabled. Alderman Knight seconded this motion and the Council voted in favor.

Ordinance #73-9 prohibiting construction of any fence, building or structure within any front yard was presented. Alderman Tate moved adoption of said ordinance. Alderman Kuhlman seconded this motion, and the Council voted unanimously in favor.

Mayor Myers advised the Council of the need for an additional administrative employee and recommended employment of an engineer. Alderman Tate moved that a newly graduated engineer be employed. Alderman Gheen seconded this motion, and the Council voted unanimous approval.

Bruce Beaty reported to the Council that the 1970 police car had blown the engine and the cost to repair would amount to about \$800.00. Alderman Kuhlman made a motion that the City Secretary and Mr. Beaty accept bids from area auto dealers and be authorized to purchase a replacement auto from the low bidder. Alderman Gheen seconded this motion and the Council voted in favor.

Alderman Gheen made a motion that a resolution authorizing Alderman Kuhlman to enter into a contract with Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and a contractor for the purpose of developing a city park on a tract of land adjacent to and north of State Highway 66 Alderman Knight seconded this motion, and the Council approved by unanimous vote.

Alderman Gheen made a motion that the minutes of the May 11, 1972 meeting be struck from the records provided this is legal. Alderman Knight seconded this motion and the motion passed by unanimous vote of the Council.

The following 5 ordinances were adapted by the unanimous vote of the Council, after a motion by Alderman Gheen was seconded by Alderman Knight: No. 73-10, rezoning of Folsom property in north west Rockwall, out of A. Hanna Survey and W. B. Bowles Survey; No. 73-11, rezoning of Folsom property located adjacent to I 30 and out of the E. P. Gaines-Chisum Survey; No. 73-12, rezoning of Folsom property located in the E. P. Gaines-Chisum and John D. McFarland Surveys; No. 73-13, rezoning a 26.213 acre tract owned by Folsom Company and out of the B. F. Boydstun And W. B. Bowles Surveys; No. 73-14, rezoning of 5.195 acre tract owned by J. P. Johnson, Kenneth English and Ward Hudspeth, out of the E. P. Gaines-Chisum Survey.

No further business came before the Council, and the meeting was adjourned.

SECTION 3. That the above described tracts of land shall be used only in the manner and for the purposes provided for by the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the City of Rockwall, as heretofore amanded and as amended herein, by the granting of this zoning change.

SECTION h. That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be subject to the same penalty as provided for in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the City of Rockwall, as heretofore amended, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine net to exceed the sum of Two Hundred Dellars (\$200.00)

for each offense.

SECTION 5. WHEREAS, it appears that the above described property requires that it be given the above zoning classification in order to permit its proper development and in order to protect the public interest and general welfare of the City of Rockwall, and creates an urgency and an emergency in the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption of said ordinance, as the lawsin such cases provides.
